act to reorganize the powers and duties; to provide for the nomination and election of candidates for public office; to provide for the resignation, removal and recall of certain public officers; to provide for the filling of vacancies in public office; to provide for and regulate primaries and elections; to provide for the purity of elections; to guard against the abuse of the elective franchise; to define violations of this act; to prescribe the penalties therefor; and to repeal certain acts and all other acts inconsistent herewith," being section 168.163 of the Compiled Laws of 1948, and to add a new section to stand as section 163a thereof.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Sections amended and added.

Section 1. Section 163 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, being section 168.163 of the Compiled Laws of 1948, is hereby amended and a new section is added to said act to stand as section 163a thereof, said amended and added sections to read as follows:
